The Department of Economics and Finance Undergraduate Distinguished Entrance Scholarships

Regulations

The Department of Economics and Finance has established the “Undergraduate Distinguished Entrance Scholarships” (previously as the “Undergraduate Entrance Scholarship”) for new intakes with its Non-UGC Reserves (Departmental) with effect from 2006-07. The following regulations shall apply as of 2012/2013 :

1. The Scholarships shall be known as “The Department of Economics and Finance Undergraduate Distinguished Entrance Scholarships”.
2. Eligible applicants for the scholarships shall be all full-time undergraduate freshmen who have been admitted to one of the Economics and Finance Department’s undergraduate programmes^[1] through JUPAS.
3. There will be a maximum of **FIFTY** Entrance Scholarships for each academic year.
 - (a) the scholarship of HK\$25,000 payable in the first year of study shall be awarded to students admitted with at least 16 points^[2] in 2 A-Level subjects or 1 A-Level plus 2 AS-Level subjects;
 - (b) the scholarship of HK\$35,000 payable in the first year of study shall be awarded to students admitted with at least 18 points^[2] in 2 A-Level subjects or 1 A-Level plus 2 AS-Level subjects;
 - (c) the scholarship of HK\$45,000 payable in the first year of study shall be awarded to students admitted with at least 20 points^[2] in 2 A-Level subjects or 1 A-Level plus 2 AS-Level subjects.
4. All recipients should obtain Grade D or above in AS Use of English or AS Chinese Language and Culture.
5. In the event that the number of qualified students is larger than the number of awards available, the Department of Economics and Finance has the discretion to decide the award winners according to other additional criteria set by the Department.
6. The scholarships shall be disbursed to the duly registered recipients by two equal installments, one after the full payment of tuition fee for Semester A by October, and the other after the full payment of tuition fee for Semester B by March of the following calendar year.

7. Nominations by the Department of Economics and Finance shall reach the Student Development Services in September/October of the academic year for which the scholarships are designated.
8. The Scholarships shall be offered annually until a notice of change is to be received from the Department of Economics and Finance.

Remark:

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the Community Relations Committee of the University Council has recommended that each award recipient is expected to make an annual donation of at least HK\$200 to City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes, whether they are donated by external donors or contributed by University funding, with effect from February 2008.

^[1] The Department's undergraduate programmes refer to: Bachelor of Business Administration (Honours) in Business Economics, Bachelor of Business Administration (Honours) in Finance, Bachelor of Business Administration (Honours) in Quantitative Finance and Risk Management

^[2] A Level: Grade A = 10 points, B = 8, C = 6, D = 4, E = 2

AS Level: Grade A = 5 points, B = 4, C = 3, D = 2, E = 1
