The Business Economics minor enables students to have a deeper understanding and knowledge of the business activities in various economic sectors. Emphasis is placed on both theory and practice relevant to Hong Kong and Asia-Pacific economies.

In addition, students shall choose from a diverse set of elective courses, especially courses that are related to the four pillars of the Hong Kong economy: international trade and commerce; industries and services; property and real estate; and banking and financial institutions.
