A Rewarding Internship Experience in Shanghai

Because I was interested in working overseas, I was motivated to take part in the Global Work Attachment Program (GWAP) in the past summer semester and was ultimately given an internship offer in a government office, the Hong Kong Economics and Trade Office in Shanghai. This experience of working in the mainland, which is appreciated by employers in the accounting field, has enhanced my employability in the departmental local internship program and given me an edge in competing for an auditing internship offer.

As a liaison and coordination intern, during my involvement in organizing different events for Shanghai- and Hong Kong-related associations, I not only intensified my coordination skills by foreseeing all possible factors related to the events and making comprehensive preparations for them, but also had opportunities to broaden my social circle through meeting leading representatives and participants from the associations.
