Exchange at Korea University 2017-18 Semester A

Some may see an overseas exchange program as a short-term holiday and an escape from the stresses of school. While this may be true for some, I undoubtedly gained more through my experience at Korea University (KU) (고려대학교 高麗大學) where I spent my last semester (2017-18 Semester A) for three months.

As business students, we should step outside our comfort zone and seize every learning opportunity to enrich our business sense before graduation. I chose KU as it was in the top three universities in South Korea, especially the Business College. It provided a rare opportunity for me to live and study in an English environment with top Korean business students who were also proficient in English. Finally, I helped to prepare the International Student Fair Festival. I met a group of students from Hong Kong and we gained a financial subsidy from KU to establish a Hong Kong booth. To effectively manage the financial support, we asked for advice from a Hong Kong entrepreneur who had opened a Hong Kong-style cafe called Charcoal Tea & Coffee in Seoul last year. He provided us with some valuable advice on cost control based on his own experience. I sought to apply my business knowledge to help write the financial proposal and efficiently manage the operation of the booth.

All in all, I believe that it is more beneficial to step outside of my comfort zone to try as many new experiences as possible rather than studying lectures at university alone. I believe in the motto 'Learning is unlimited'. Knowledge is not only learned from textbooks, but also from personal experiences. Let's go global and treasure your overseas exchange opportunity!
