Through the program, I obtained an offer from a fast-growing e-commerce company in Berlin for an international accounting internship and experienced a meaningful summer.

I made notes about the most common German words, the most important suppliers and the process of invoice approval. After days of practice, I successfully became familiar with the process and was able to handle it on my own. The accounting information system was also totally new to me. However, I did lots of self-initiated "homework," including watching instruction videos and practicing. Through this practice, I became familiar with the tasks and was able to complete the work efficiently using the system.

Through this internship, I not only learnt many technical skills such as dealing with the information system and Microsoft software, but also came to know more about the communication skills needed in a multi-cultural workplace and the importance of teamwork. These benefits of the program have helped me to become a more competent young professional with a clearer career plan. I have also gained a greater understanding of the knowledge I learnt in class. In addition, living in Berlin without my family and acquaintances enhanced my general abilities in everyday life, and exposure to European countries has helped me to further understand global viewpoints with a more open mind.

The improvements in my abilities and mind suggest that taking part in CityU's GWAP had a very positive influence on me. I believe it is beneficial to grasp opportunities with courage. 
