

## Editorial Policy

### Author Guidelines

1. All manuscript submissions to the *Asia-Pacific Journal of Accounting and Economics (APJAE)* must be original works written in English and must NOT be submitted elsewhere while being considered for the *APJAE*. To ensure impartiality and quality, all manuscripts submitted to the Journal are subject to a double-blind review process before they are accepted for publication.
2. Manuscripts (one copy in Microsoft Word (doc) and another in Portable Document Format (pdf)) should be submitted by email (with a subject line “APJAE Submission”) or by post on a CD with a non-refundable submission fee. The pdf file will be used for review and should not contain any information of the authors.
3. Submissions should be made to one of the following editorial offices according to the location of the (corresponding) author’s affiliation. Authors from regions other than Hong Kong, Taiwan and the US may make submissions to any one of the editorial offices.

4. Payment for the submission fee should be made by checks or bank drafts only. Do not send cash. The review process will only begin upon receipt of the submission fee.
5. For submissions to the **Hong Kong office**, the checks/bank drafts of US\$100/HK\$780 for individual subscribers and US\$150/HK\$1,170 for others should be made payable to “CITY UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG”.

For submissions to the **North America office**, the checks/bank drafts of US\$100 for individual subscribers and US\$150 for others should be made payable to “APJAE”.

For submissions to the **Taipei office**, the checks/bank drafts of US\$100/ NT\$ 3,200 for individual subscribers and US\$150/ NT\$ 4,800 for others should be made payable to “COLLEGE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES, NATIONAL TAIWAN UNIVERSITY”. 6. To subscribe, download a subscription form from [www.roae.org](http://www.roae.org).

7. The Journal is not responsible for any damage or loss of manuscripts submitted. All hardcopies and electronic materials will be disposed of two months after publication or rejection of the manuscript.
8. Upon acceptance of the manuscript for publication, the authors will be asked to transfer the copyright of the manuscript to the publisher. The transfer will ensure the widest possible dissemination of information, including, but not limited to, print and electronic modes of dissemination. The author or the corresponding author must sign and return the Release of Copyright Form to the Journal before the manuscript can be published. Authors must declare any sponsorship or financial ties that may cause conflicts of interests.
9. Before publication, the manuscript will be copy-edited and typeset. A page proof will be sent to the corresponding author for proofreading and the responsibility for detecting errors lies with the author. The author must follow the instructions accompanying the proof and return the proof **within one week** via email or courier. Corrections should be restricted to instances in which the page proof is at variance with the manuscript. Extensive alterations will be charged. After publication, the authors will each receive a free copy of the relevant issue.

## Style Guide

Manuscripts which do not conform to this style guide may be returned for the necessary revisions before publication.

1. Manuscripts should be double spaced with wide margins. Titles and subtitles should be short. Use American spelling. Ensure that the letter “l” and the digit “1” and the letters “o”, “O” and the digit “0” are used properly.
2. The first page should contain the following information:
  - a. the title;
  - b. the full name(s) and institutional affiliation(s) of the author(s);
  - c. up to *three* JEL Classification codes;
  - d. up to *five* keywords;
  - e. an abstract of *not* more than 100 words;
  - f. a footnote marked by the number sign (#) containing the fax number(s), email address(es) and mailing address(es) of the corresponding author or author(s); and
  - g. an optional footnote marked by an asterisk (\*) for acknowledgements and information on grants.
3. Formulas should be placed against the right-hand margin of the page and numbered in parentheses consecutively throughout the manuscript (for example, (1), (2)). In cases where the derivation of formulas has been abbreviated, it is of great help to the referees if the full derivation can be presented on a separate sheet (not to be published) upon request.
4. Footnotes should be kept to a minimum, single spaced and numbered consecutively throughout the text with superscript Arabic numerals.
5. All diagrams, graphs and charts should be referred to as “figures” and tables as “tables” in the text. All figures and tables should be placed on separate pages and numbered sequentially with Arabic numerals. Their approximate position should be indicated in

the text. Illustrations will be reproduced photographically from originals supplied by the authors. They will not be redrawn by the publisher.

6. References should adhere to the following style.

**Citations in text:** must include the author's last name and year of publication. eg "Smith (1992) reported that ...", "This problem has been studied previously (Smith, 1992)"

**Reference list:** should be double spaced and listed alphabetically by the authors' last names (by year within the same author(s) and by title within the same year). Make sure that all citations used in the text are listed and matched. It should appear at the end of the main text, after appendices and before figures.

- **Books:** Author(s), year, title, (city of publication: publisher). For example, Hawawini, G. and I. Swary, 1990, *Mergers and Acquisitions in the U.S. Banking Industry: Evidence from the Capital Markets* (North-Holland:Amsterdam).
- **An article from a collective work:** Author(s), year, article title, in: editors, book title, (city of publication: publisher), pages. For example, Brunner, K. and A. H. Meltzer, 1990, "Money supply", in: B. M. Friedman and F. H. Hahn, eds., *Handbook of Monetary Economics*, Vol. 1 (North-Holland,Amsterdam), 357-396.
- **Periodicals:** Author(s), year, article title, journal title, volume and issue number, pages. For example, Smith, C. W., Jr. and R. L. Watts, 1992, "The Investment Opportunity Set and Corporate Financing Dividend, and Compensation Policies", *Journal of Financial Economics* 32, 263–292.
