The Department of Accountancy - Entrance Scholarships for
Master of Science in Professional Accounting and Corporate Governance –
Corporate Governance Stream (MScPACG – CG Stream)

Regulations

The Department of Accountancy has agreed to establish scholarships from its Non-UGC Reserves for the new intakes of Master of Science in Professional Accounting and Corporate Governance – Corporate Governance Stream (MScPACG – CG Stream) students with effect from 2018/2019 academic year. The following regulations shall apply as of 2021/2022:

1. The Scholarships shall be known as the “The Department of Accountancy – Entrance Scholarships for MSc Professional Accounting and Corporate Governance – CG Stream”.
2. There shall be a maximum of TWO scholarships per annum. The value of each scholarship shall be HK\$10,000. The amount shall be used to settle part of the awardee’s Semester B tuition fee of the programme.
3. The Scholarships are restricted to students admitted into the MScPACG – CG Stream through admission with outstanding entrance academic performance. The minimum CGPA is 3.2 out of 4 or equivalent.
4. The Department of Accountancy has sole discretion to decide the awardees according to criteria set by the Department. Other achievements of the students may also be taken into consideration.
5. Nominations from the Department of Accountancy shall reach the Student Development Services by the end of October each year and the awards shall then be made as early as possible. The Department of Accountancy reserves the right to make final decision on the nominations.
6. Confirmation will be sought from the Department of Accountancy before July of each year on whether or not the Scholarships will be continued for the following academic year.

Remark:

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the Community Relations Committee of the University Council has recommended that each award recipient is expected to make an annual donation of at least HK\$200 to City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes, whether they are donated by external donors or contributed by University funding, with effect from February 2008.
