### Note:

#### 1. English Language Requirement

Students admitted with HKDSE English Level 3 or equivalent are required to complete two 3-credit unit EAP courses, <u>LC0200A</u> English for Academic Purposes 1\* and <u>LC0200B</u> English for Academic Purposes 2", prior to taking the 2 GE English courses (GE 1401 and GE2402).

#### \* Early Exit Arrangement

Students who demonstrate that they have achieved a grade B or above in their overall course results for <u>LC0200A</u> will achieve 3 credits and also be considered to have satisfied the pre-requisite for entry to the GE English courses without needing to take <u>LC0200B</u>. For details, please visit the <u>website</u> of University Language Requirements.

#### 3. Chinese Language Requirement

Students scoring below Level 4 in HKDSE Chinese Language, or scoring below Grade D in HKALE AS-level Chinese Language and Culture are required to take a 3-credit unit course CHIN1001 University Chinese I.

# 4. Major Course (Major Core / Major Elective)

- o Single-major students: 30 credit units for Major cores / Major Electives
- Double-major students: 30 credit units for Major cores / Major Electives from home department + at least 27 credit units for Major cores / Major electives from second major department(See 5# & 6#)
- 5. College Elective Students are required to take 9 credit units from the College elective list
  - # For students declaring BBA double major, 9 credit units of College Elective will be exempted. These 9 credit units can be used to fulfil the second major requirement. If students fail to complete the second major requirement in the end, they still need to complete the College elective requirement mentioned above.

## 6. Minor / Free Elective requirement

Students who do not choose a minor are required to take Elective courses. The remaining credits are to fulfil the credit requirement for graduation, if so required.

# For students declaring BBA double major, Minor / Free Elective can be used to fulfil the second major requirement.

For BBA students, in the case that the same course being offered in the Major and in College Electives, the credit units earned will count only once, for fulfilling the Major requirement, then for fulfilling the College requirement. Students have to take another College elective course to make up for the freed credit units. Students are responsible for ensuring the College and Major requirements being fulfilled to obtain graduation qualification.
