Aiming to Excel in Competitions

Our students have shone in an array of competitions and scholarship programmes over the past year, including those organised within CityU and those by external institutions such as the Big Four. The experience has broadened their growth prospects, business networks and horizons, and testifies to the Department's robust support for its students in reaching their academic and career goals.

Let's see what they've been up to . . .

Deloitte Tax Championship

Dr Raymond Wong led and advised a team of four students in the Regional Competition of the Deloitte Tax Championship, an annual one-day event held to test students' knowledge of taxation in the Greater China region. Having written a case study in the morning, the students took up the MC challenge and showed off their quiz skills in the afternoon. Through the championship they developed collaborative skills, in-depth knowledge of China tax and were even invited to a networking lunch and dinner with many audit/tax partners and managers in attendance.

"The most challenging aspect of the championship was the depth and breadth of China tax, as the students had to put great effort into studying, discovering, analysing and predicting many possible topics within a limited period", says Dr Wong of their preparation. "The Department and Deloitte offered support in searching for information about China tax materials, including our own training forums and a mock case study writing session with feedback provided."



PricewaterhouseCoopers Scholarship Programme



Tsang Ah Hung Henry, one of our BBAAC students, reached the final eighth in the PricewaterhouseCoopers Scholarship Programme 2011. He says that the programme helped him to gain a better understanding of himself, learn more about the daily working life of audit partners and meet elite students from different universities. Remaining humble despite his strong performance, he credits others for his achievement:

"Being one of the eight runners-up is not my achievement alone. I would like to thank professors from the Department for their help with my preparation and the managers and partners at PwC for their guidance and advice."

Other Open Competitions

Our students also joined the HKICS Corporate Governance Paper Competition & Presentation Award and the CIMA Global Business Challenge Competition during the year. Organised by the Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries, the HKICS Corporate Governance Paper Competition & Presentation Award pitted two teams of three AC students against representatives of other universities.

Led by Drs Raymond Wong and Yuanto Kusnadi, the teams gave presentations on the year's topic, "Corporate Governance – Best Practice versus Practicality". The two teams were very appreciative of the time their advisors spent helping them prepare for the competition. The biggest benefit, they say, was learning how to present the material effectively and creatively. As Dr Kusnadi notes, "the competition helped them to work as teams and increase their confidence in presenting to an audience".

Meanwhile, preparation for the CIMA Global Business Challenge Competition, organised by the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants, involved countless hours of brainstorming, research and review by the team of four year one AC students, who found the competition both challenging and effective in expanding their business horizons. Without a doubt, participating in the event helped them to become more diligent, logical and confident, which will certainly be useful in their careers.



A Review of 2010/11 Internships

Over the past several years, the Department has provided countless opportunities for students to gain valuable internship experience in professional firms. These internships not only offer an excellent chance for students to manage themselves effectively in a professional work setting, but also enable them to establish networks for their future career development.

In keeping with this tradition, during the 2010/11 academic year the Department nominated almost 100 students for a variety of internships and work placements in Hong Kong and overseas. These included local internships at professional audit

firms such as PwC, Deloitte and KPMG, as well as internships at the RSM, Grant Thornton and BDO offices in Singapore. A number of students were given the opportunity to work outside the auditing sector: internships were offered at the Hospital Authority and the Inland Revenue Department as well as at Hang Seng Bank and cosmetics outlet Colourmix.

Upon completion of their internships, students were asked to report on their experiences, and many responded with enthusiasm. Featured in this article is just a sample of students who made the workplace journey and came back the better for it.

Looking ahead

In addition to expanding the existing internship scheme to a greater number of local and overseas firms, the Department is now formalising it into a credit-bearing course. Students will be given due recognition on their transcripts, and receive more effective feedback on their performance.

We look forward to new opportunities for students to put their classroom learning into practice, the ultimate goal of which is to help them set their own career paths.

She talks to Wong Yat-hei about how she was awarded an internship at Deloitte's auditing sector for the global financial services industry (GFSI) division

What is your academic background?

I am studying a BBA (Hons) degree in accountancy and law at City University.

How do you start your day?

During the first week of my internship, I attended a one-week training course to learn about accounting techniques. I also had lectures on ethical issues in accounting. After training, I was assigned to assist some of Deloitte's permanent staff.

What does your job entail?

I work at the GFSI division of the auditing sector, which is responsible for financial institution

clients. I follow the company's staff on visits to clients' offices, prepare trial balances, financial statements, and so on. I also assist with administrative work.

What are the major challenges you have encountered so far?

Assisting colleagues in the preparation of accounting documents can be complicated.

What have you learned about your chosen career and what are your plans?

Unlike most white-collar employees, an auditor does not stay in one place at all times. Also, you need to have good interpersonal skills to get on well with clients.

Any advice for potential interns?

Recognise your weaknesses and capitalise on your talents. The key to success is to have a sincere heart and a desire to learn.

Hubei Summer Cultural Study Tour 2011



Amidst the centenary celebrations for the 1911 Revolution last year, the College of Business arranged for AC students to join counterparts from other Hong Kong universities on a journey back through time in Hubei during June.

The students attended seminars on professional exchange and explored business practices through case studies at Huazhong University of Science and Technology. They also visited scenic spots and historical sites, including the majestic Yangtze River, the antique Baidi temple, the site of the Revolution's military government, and the 1911 Revolution Museum.

The tour put the students in touch with China's turbulent past and helped them understand how vital it has been in building modern China.

Reflecting on her time in Hubei, BBAAC student Tracy Chan Chui Sze says, "One can definitely imagine how people struggled and laboured on the road to democracy and success!"

There was also a sense that the Revolution still had an influence at a personal level.

"If there was no 1911 Revolution, we would still be living under the control of the colonial regime and our lives would definitely be harder", according to Biz Chan Chi Sing, another BBAAC student.

The tour also helped to build friendships amongst the students. At the farewell dinner, the Hong Kong students sang and danced to thank local students for their warm welcome and hospitality. Laughter filled the air and the evening was replete with unforgettable moments.

With the 3-3-4 Curriculum to launch in 2012/13, the Department will welcome two batches of students at the same time – those with HKALE results and those with HKDSE results.

This gives us the opportunity to revamp our programme structure, with capstone courses to be introduced for first and final year students so they can more effectively apply what they learn in class to the business world. We will also roll out business ethics courses focused on the finance industry for final year students.

The incoming HKDSE students will undertake four years of study at CityU, and will be admitted through a common admissions scheme. During the first year, they will be encouraged to acquire business and general knowledge through business core and Gateway Education courses. They will then be able to apply for majors in their second year.

Professor Yi Cheong Heon received his PhD from the University of California, Los Angeles. Before joining CityU, he was a faculty member at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University for 14 years, teaching financial accounting and corporate governance courses. He is also an active participant in world conferences such as the CAR Section of the 2009 CAR/JCAE Joint Symposium, the AAA Annual Meeting, the Canadian Academic Accounting Association Annual Conference and the AFAANZ Annual Conference.

Dr Zheng Liu received her PhD from the University of Southern California. Before joining CityU, she worked as Assistant Professor at the University of Hong Kong. Dr Zheng's primary research interests are in financial reporting and capital market regulations. She is also interested in auditing, corporate governance and CEO compensation. Her teaching interests include both financial accounting and managerial accounting. In her spare time, Dr Zheng enjoys travelling, hiking and reading.

Dr Zheng's articles have been published in renowned journals such as *the Journal of Accounting and Economics*, *the International Review of Finance and Accounting*, *Organizations and Society*. Her perspective on accounting has been published in a casebook called *Management Control Systems: Performance Measurement, Evaluation and Incentives* by London: Financial Times/Prentice-Hall.
