Departmental Retreat to Reengineer the Curriculum

In late April, a Departmental Retreat was organised at the Novotel Hotel Hong Kong Citygate to discuss the possibility of fine-tuning the curriculum to provide even better theoretical and practical training for accountancy students, as an extra academic year will be included in the new 3-3-4 education system.

Over 40 academic staff participated in this 2-day think tank event, aiming to define a better programme framework to cultivate our students to be the next generation's accounting pillars.

This retreat featured a series of speeches, presentations, meetings and brainstorming workshops. Industry and educational experts provided a great number of ideas. Together with the contributions from our academic staff, a sophisticated curriculum framework

was established to further enhance our students' learning experience.

We received great support from industry leaders and professional academies. Mr Philip Tsai, a senior partner of Deloitte, who also serves as the Chairman of our Departmental Advisory Committee, kindly told us what employers were expecting from students.

Professor Vijay Bhatia from the Department of English also analysed the role of accountants in modern society for us. Mr David Santandreu Calonge, from the Education Development Office gave a briefing on how to uplift students and to develop their confidence and self-image, while an alumnus of our Department, Mr Allan Lee, suggested ways of enhancing students' survival skills.

New Scholarship Attracts International Students

A new entrance scholarship has been established by the Department to attract international students, a move aimed at establishing CityU as a global education institution.

Hong Kong, as the most significant commercial hub of China, attracts competitive students from all over the world. The Department initiated the scholarship, Undergraduate Entrance Scholarships for

International Students, to target these incoming international elites.

Recipients of this scholarship can receive up to HK\$100,000 per annum during their study at CityU with which finance their tuition fees and living expenses in Hong Kong.

Eligible students should graduate from non-local high schools, originate from countries

other than the PRC and achieve outstanding academic performance.

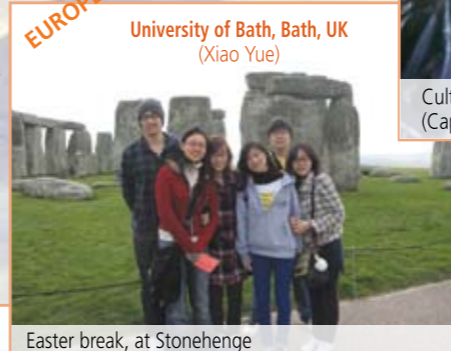

This year, FKT Grant Thornton came to the campus to give career talks. For interested students, we provided workshops to enhance their soft skills, and then took them to Singapore for cultural immersion and job interviews.

"Surely I made a right decision to join this study tour and fight for the internship opportunity", concluded Wong.



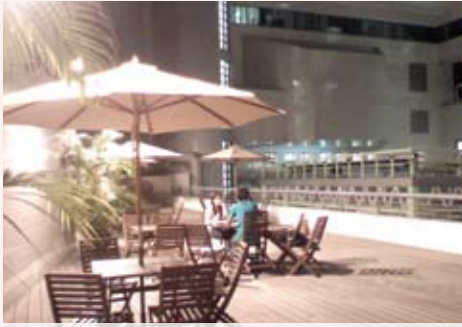

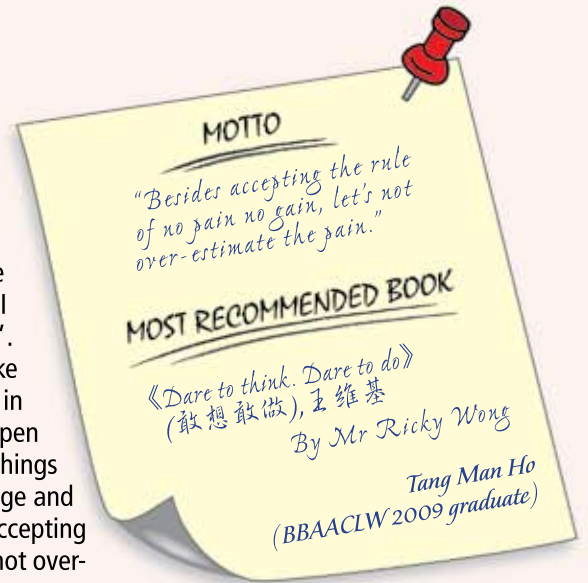
Embracing University Life

Three Accountancy second-year students were honoured with Certificates of Merit as Top 18 Winners in the SCMP/IFPHK Financial Planner Awards 2008.

The Department encourages and supports its students to take part in public competitions, which is the best way to put knowledge into practice. “It was the first time for us to join a competition like this”, said the students, “we receive great support from our teachers”.

According to the students, the competition not only enriched their university life, but also granted them the opportunity to have a more in depth understanding of the finance industry.

Jointly organised by the South China Morning Post and Institute of Financial Planners of Hong Kong, the Awards recognise university students who excel in their professional knowledge and demonstrate financial planning skills at the highest level.

Based on a standard case, students had to submit financial analyses and give presentations, which were judged by a group of finance professionals.

Victorious CityU Student Addresses UN Development Goals

By demonstrating her grasp of world health issues, Wang Yanan, a Year 1 student of the Department of Accountancy at CityU, triumphed over more than 100 student delegate submissions from around the world to win the Best Position Paper Award in an event organised by the Hong Kong Model United Nations Club.

Wang Yanan submitted two papers on water sanitation and disease control in the US, the country she was nominated to represent, for entry to the club's Hong Kong Model United Nations Conference 2009.

She pointed out that diseases endangering the health of people in developing countries had to be curbed to accomplish the United Nation's Millennium Development Goals. She also suggested creative ways, such as pooled financing and revolving funds, to attract funding to help developing countries address water and sanitation issues.

The papers were evaluated based on the organisation of ideas and message communicated. Her papers provided an account of the US' history in relation to the topic, how the US is affected by the issues,

its political and foreign policies in this regard and her proposed resolution.

"CityU teachers always reiterate the importance of global vision. I participated in this activity in order to gain a better understanding of different national cultures through discussion of the topics at the conference", Wang Yanan said. She also found that the critical thinking and organisational skills acquired at CityU had been helpful in analysing the data.

The club is supported by the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China in the HKSAR, the Constitutional and Mainland Affairs Bureau and the Education Bureau of the Government of the HKSAR. The 2009 conference attracted more than 400 university students from Hong Kong, mainland China and overseas who formed more than 50 delegations representing different countries from around the world.

Established in 2005, the club aims at raising youth awareness of global issues and instilling in them the United Nation's peace-keeping spirit through activities that simulate the United Nations' General Assembly.
