Biography of Speakers

Dr. ROBINSON, David, is the Senior Research Fellow of Oxford Institute for Energy Studies (OIES). He is an economist specializing in public policy and corporate strategy in the energy sector. His research and publications at the Institute cover US energy and climate policy, Sino-EU collaboration in renewable energy, and more generally the process and implications of electricity sector de-carbonization.

Mr. SHEK, Colin, China News Editor at Interfax Energy. He is an aspiring foreign correspondent based in Shanghai, China. He researches, writes, and reports on topics about foreign energy policy in China.

Mr. CHAN, S H, JP, is Managing Director – China of CLP Holdings. He is responsible for the company's diversified portfolio in the Mainland which encompasses a wide range of technologies from nuclear, coal, hydro to renewables. Mr. Chan also plays an active role in academic, professional and community services. For example, he is an Adjunct Professor of the Department of Mechanical and Biomedical Engineering of the City University and a member of HKSAR Government's Council for Sustainable Development and the Construction Industry Council. In the Mainland, Mr. Chan has been appointed as a member of the 11th Guangdong Provincial Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference.

Mr. NG, Donald, is currently the Principal Assistant Secretary for the Environment (Electricity Reviews) of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, responsible for the review of the development of the electricity market in Hong Kong and related policy matters. Before taking up the current position, he was the Deputy Representative of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region to the World Trade Organization based in Geneva. He also worked on a number of policy areas, including transport, housing and aviation security.
