The Hong Kong Ph.D. Fellowship Scheme, established by the Hong Kong Research Grants Council, aims to bring talented students from around the world to Hong Kong to undertake Ph.D. studies. Fellowship applicants, who are also Ph.D. program applicants, should demonstrate outstanding qualities in:

- (1) academic performance;
- (2) research ability and potential;
- (3) communication and interpersonal skills; and
- (4) leadership ability.

Each Fellowship awardee receives a financial award consisting of a CYC SGS Entrance Scholarship (covering tuition and on-campus hostel fees for the first year of research study), a monthly stipend, and a conference and research-related travel allowance (for more details on the HKPFS, see http://www.sgs.cityu.edu.hk/prospective/RPg/HKPhD).
