(1) English Language Requirement
dents admitted with HKDSE English Level 3 or equivalent are required to complete two 3-credit EAP courses, LCO200A English for Academic Purposes 1^ and LC0200B English for Academic Purposes 2, prior to taking the 2 GE English courses (GE1401 University English and GE2402 English for Business Communication). LC0200A \& LC0200B will not be counted towards the minimum credit units required for graduation and will not be included in the calculation of CGPA. However, they will be counted towards the ${ }^{\wedge}$ maximum credit Exit Arits permitted.
Students who demonstrate that they have achieved a grade B or above in their overall course results for LCO200A will achieve 3 creaits and also be considered to have satisfied the pre-requisite for entry to the GE English courses without needing to take LCO200B.
