The Department of Management Outstanding Academic Performance Scholarships (Undergraduate Program)

Regulations

The Department of Management has agreed to establish four annual scholarships in the University by use of the funding available in the Non-UGC Reserves (Departmental) with effect from 2022-2023 academic year under the following regulations:

- 1. The Scholarships shall be known as the "The Department of Management Outstanding Academic Performance Scholarships (Undergraduate Program)" (管 理學系卓越成績獎 – 學士課程).
- 2. There shall be NINE awards per annum. The value of each award shall be HK\$10,000.
- 3. The Scholarships shall be granted to undergraduate students in BBA Management, who are pursuing their 2nd, 3rd or 4th year of study in the current year and have met the following criteria:
 - Have been the top academic performers in his/her class of BBA Management in the previous academic year.
 - *Have taken at least 30 credit units in the previous academic year.*
 - *Have good conduct.*
- 4. In case that the number of eligible nominees exceeds the quota of this Scholarships, the Department of Management has the discretion to apply additional criteria for selection.
- 5. The awardees are expected to complete their BBA Management studies in CityU at the end. The Department of Management reserves the right to demand for full refund of the scholarship should any recipient fails to complete the BBA Management program.
- 6. The Department of Management will form a panel to select the award winners. Nominations from the Department of Management will reach the Student Development Services in June of the academic year for which the scholarships are designated.
- 7. If in any year no student is found to be of sufficient merit, the award will be withheld.

<u>Remark</u> :

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote caring culture, the University encourages each award recipient to make an annual donation of HK\$200 or more to the City University of Hong Kong for student support via CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes since February 2008.
