## The Department of Management Sciences Student Development Scholarships

### Regulations

The Department of Management Sciences of the City University of Hong Kong offers Student Development Scholarships to undergraduate students whose performance in extra-curricular activities is of exceptionally high standard, and who aspire to compete in local and international competitions approved by the department. These scholarships have been made available through the department's Non-UGC Reserve fund. The following regulations shall apply as of 2020/2021:

1. *The Scholarship shall be known as the "The Department of Management Sciences Student Development Scholarships".*
2. *There shall be up to 20 awards per year. The value of each award shall be HK\$1,000 to HK\$2,000. The maximum amount of the funds in a given year will not exceed HK\$30,000 in total.*
3. *The Scholarships shall be awarded to full-time 1<sup>st</sup> major students from the undergraduate programmes offered by the Department of Management Sciences.*
4. *Students are selected based on the following criteria: i) exceptionally outstanding performance in extra-curricular activities; ii) winning record in internal and external competitions; iii) participation in departmental services (e.g., student mentoring, study group leadership); and iv) academic performance.*
5. *Nominations from the Department of Management Sciences shall reach the Student Development Services by the end of June each year.*
6. *Confirmation on the renewal of the awards for the following academic year will be sought from the Department of Management Sciences before September each year.*

#### **Remark:**

With an objective to nurture our students and to promote a caring culture, the Community Relations Committee of the University Council has recommended that each award recipient is expected to make an annual donation of at least HK\$200 to the City University of Hong Kong for student support via the CityU Alumni Giving Club when they are in employment after graduation. This term has been incorporated into all scholarship/prize/award/bursary schemes, whether they are donated by external donors or contributed by University funding, with effect from February 2008.
